# Music Minister Report

March 15, 2016

Holy Week, the week preceding Easter and the last week of Lent, commemorates the Passion of Christ and begins on Palm Sunday and includes Spy Wednesday, Maundy (Holy) Thursday, Good Friday, and concludes on Holy Saturday. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are known as the Easter Triduum.

Palm Sunday recalls Jesus' triumphal entry in Jerusalem, an event mentioned in the four Gospels. The Procession includes the people carrying palm branches and chanting, "Hosanna!" We will begin the Sunday Service on Palm Sunday at the labyrinth, read the Gospel account of the entry into Jerusalem, recite a Psalm, and process into the Church.

Spy Wednesday is used in reference to Judas Iscariot's intent to betray Jesus. The word, "Spy," means to ambush, to deceive. Spy Wednesday will be commemorated by participating in a "Way of the Cross in the Taizé tradition."

Maundy (Holy) Thursday re-enacts the Washing of the Feet and First Institution of the Holy Eucharist by Jesus Christ to his Apostles. The music includes the famous, "Ubi caritas est vera, Deus ibi est." ("Where true charity is, there is God.") After celebrating the Eucharist, the Altar is stripped in silence and the Blessed Sacrament is retired to the Altar of Repose.

Good Friday commemorates the Passion and Death of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. There is no celebration of the Holy Eucharist. The Service contains soft, contemplative hymns, Psalms, and the Reproaches, intoned during the Veneration of the Cross.

The Great Vigil of Easter begins in complete silence and darkness while the Easter Fire is lit. The *Exsultet* is proclaimed. There are several Readings and Psalm Responses which very gradually increase in volume and intensity. Before the singing of the *Gloria*, the priest proclaims, "Alleluia! Christ is risen!" Our response: "The Lord is risen, indeed. Alleluia!"
